# CONNECTIONS



## **Air Connections**


We have the Chetumal International Airport, which offers direct domestic flights to major cities such as Mexico City, Guadalajara, and Monterrey. In addition, it is relatively close to the Cancun International Airport, which facilitates the arrival of international visitors to the region.



### Land Connections

The southern region of Quintana Roo is well connected by road through Federal Highway 307, which links the south of the state with important tourist destinations such as Playa del Carmen and Cancun to the north, and Belize to the south. This highway facilitates access to cities such as Chetumal, Bacalar, Mahahual, and Xcalak. There is also a public transportation and bus network that connects Chetumal with other cities in the southeast of Mexico.





## Mayan Train

The Mayan Train stations in Chetumal and Bacalar will be key to boosting the economic and tourist growth of these cities. In Chetumal, the station will strengthen its role as a hub for international connectivity and trade, while in Bacalar, the station is expected to promote sustainable tourism and infrastructure development, while respecting the natural environment. Both stations will boost investment, employment and development in the southern region of Quintana Roo.

## **Maritime Connections**

From the port of Chetumal, vessels operate offering transportation to San Pedro and Cayo Caulker in Belize, facilitating an international connection by sea. Mahahual, another important tourist port, receives cruise ships that stop in the Mexican Caribbean, connecting the region with international maritime routes.

## **International Connections**

The proximity of Quintana Roo to Belize makes the southern region a key international crossing point by land across the border at the Subteniente López International Bridge, which connects Chetumal with Corozal, Belize. This crossing is used for both trade and tourism, creating an international gateway to entry and exit.





# **CULTURE**

The Mayan culture in Quintana Roo is a living legacy that manifests itself in its history, traditions, and spirituality. Ancient cities such as Cobá and Tulum reflect the advancement in astronomy and architecture of this civilization. Today, indigenous communities keep alive customs such as the Mayan language and traditional festivities such as Hanal Pixán. The spiritual connection with nature, especially with cenotes, remains fundamental. In addition, there are efforts to preserve and revitalize this heritage through educational and tourism projects, attracting both locals and international visitors.

# **TOURIST ATTRACTIONS**

The southern region of Quintana Roo is a region rich in natural beauty, history and culture, offering a wide variety of tourist attractions that attract visitors from around the world. Among the most notable destinations are:



#### **Bacalar Lagoon**

Known as the Lagoon of Seven Colors, Bacalar is one of the region's main attractions. Its crystal-clear, turquoise waters, ideal for swimming, kayaking and snorkeling, make it a natural paradise. In addition, the historic Fort of San Felipe, built to defend the region from pirates, offers a look at the area's colonial past.

#### Chetumal

The capital of Quintana Roo is an important cultural and commercial center. The Museum of Mayan Culture is an essential stop for those who want to learn about the history and legacy of this civilization. The Boulevard Bahía, which runs along the coast, is perfect for a stroll at sunset and enjoying the view of Chetumal Bay.









### Mahahual

This quiet coastal town is known for its white sand beaches and crystalclear waters, perfect for diving and snorkeling. Banco Chinchorro, a coral reef and nature reserve, is a must-see for diving enthusiasts, where you can explore reefs, shipwrecks and observe marine fauna.

#### Kohunlich

This Mayan archaeological zone is famous for its Temple of the Masks, a structure with huge stucco masks representing Mayan gods. Surrounded by the jungle, Kohunlich is a less crowded archaeological site but full of history and nature.

#### Dzibanché and Kinichná

These two archaeological zones are close to each other and offer an authentic experience of Mayan culture, with large structures and temples immersed in the jungle. Dzibanché was an important political center in its time, while Kinichná stands out for its main temple.





#### Sian Ka'an Biosphere Reserve (South Zone)

This nature reserve, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, extends to the south of Quintana Roo. It is a refuge for biodiversity, with mangroves, lagoons, coral reefs and wildlife. It offers low-impact ecotourism, such as bird watching, boat tours and cenote exploration.

#### Cenotes in the Southern Zone

Although they are better known in the north of the peninsula, in the south of Quintana Roo there are also impressive cenotes, such as the Cenote Azul in Bacalar, ideal for swimming and diving in its deep, crystal-clear waters.
